

Market turns 100

CELEBRATIONS to mark the 100th anniversary of Durban's historic Early Morning Market went off without a hitch, despite speculation that the event could be disrupted by protesters angry at plans to build a shopping centre on the site.

Deputy Mayor Logie Naidoo said he was grateful to have been invited. "I am so pleased to be here to mark this occasion. The Indian Diaspora is found all over the world. We have a proud and rich history and we must celebrate it."

He touched on the dispute between market traders and the Municipality over the

planned mall. "There are many issues that need to be addressed, challenges that we must face. We must chart a way forward by talking to each other and we must be united."

Guest speakers, songs and dances formed part of the programme, with the climax being the cutting of a cake shaped like the Truro, the ship that brought the first batch of indentured Indian labourers to Durban in 1860.

Harry Ramlall, Chairman of the Early Morning Market Association, said, "They came as indentured labourers working in sugar cane fields. They endured many hardships, and were often beaten. We are the fruits of that labour."

He made a call for the Early Morning Market to be declared a heritage site. "We need to be here, because people's livelihoods depend on it. We must not forget the role of the traders."

Roy Chetty, of the Social Indaba Movement, said, "We must not forget the legacy left by the 1860 labourers. We must celebrate it and remember that history is unbroken in practice. We must follow the Satyagraha teachings of Mahatma Gandhi."

Guest of Honour Muhammed Omar said, "The ground we stand on has served many generations. We must preserve it."
